Our next meeting will be a lightpainting workshop at the old gun emplacements at Middle Head.

You will learn:

- What camera settings to use
- The use of various lighting techniques
- Visit an amazing place

We will be meeting at the car park at the end of Military Road, Mosman by 7pm. You will go past HMAS Penguin on the way in. The walk to the emplacements is easy and only about 300 metres.

What to bring.

- Camera that will allow at least a 30 second exposure or Bulb
- Spare camera battery

- Wide angle zoom, or your favourite lens less than 100mm
- Remote release if you have one (not essential unless you want to use the Bulb option on your camera)
- Tripod
- Flash
- LED head lamp
- Good torch for light painting (not essential)
- Coloured cellophane to put over your torch
- Warm clothes, including beanie (it is winter)
- Solid shoes or boots
- Any props that you think would work well in the photos (e.g. tennis rackets to hit balls with lights, old electric guitar, fancy clothes)
- Anything with coloured lights. For example, your children's flashing toys, coloured torch, glow sticks, sparklers, Star Wars lightsaber, bouncing LED balls, LED hula hoop or anything else in your kids or grandkids toy box that has lights.
- Sparklers
- Your imagination
